

#### SYNOPSIS:

On 07/23/2019, about 12:44 p.m., the below describe suspect approached a woman in "D" Lot and offered inappropriate compliments. When the woman walked away, the suspect followed and continued his unwanted and inappropriate comments. The suspect ultimately exposed his genitals and ran away. The UPD responded immediately and determined the suspect had fled the campus. The same individual appears to have initiated contact with at least one other woman on campus today. The UPD is diligently following investigative leads in the effort to apprehend the suspect.

**UPDATE:** On 07/24/2019, at 12:55 pm, during follow-up investigation, UPD located and arrested Brian Williams, a 33-year-old self-described transient. Mr. Williams was identified as the Indecent Exposure suspect and booked at the Sheriff's Central Detention Center.

#### Safety Reminders:

- 1. When someone's behavior is threatening, clearly disruptive, bizarre or extraordinarily provocative, immediately call the UPD.
- If you desire added safety to your campus walk, invite a friend, request a free CSO escort or use the LiveSafe SafeWalk application on your smart phone.
- 3. Walk with a deliberate pace and confident posture. Keep your head up with a good view of your surroundings. Politely acknowledge others in your immediate area, but do not engage with those you find threatening.
- If confronted by unwanted solicitation, express clearly and firmly you are not interested in the offering.
- 5. Do not argue or go out of your way to challenge the offending behavior, as the unreasonable rarely offer a positive response.
- 6. If you believe an unwanted solicitation is unreasonable for the campus environment, report your experience to the UPD. To report an emergency, call 9-1-1 or text 911 from your cellular phone.
