Question 1: What relevant experience or skills would you bring to your appointment as a Student Representative on the SMSU Board of Directors?

As a student representative, I've spent the past two years connecting the ideas, concerns, and lived experiences students have shared with me, especially around how the Santos Manuel Student Union can better serve us through culture, care, and community. I've been a strong voice both in and outside the boardroom, leading with empathy and always centering issues that hit close to home like basic needs, food insecurity, and policies that ensure SMSU stays rooted in students.

Professionally, I bring a strong background in outreach and accessible marketing; these skills I believe are vital on a campus made up largely of commuter students. Visibility shouldn't be a barrier to support. As a business major focused on audience engagement, my goal is to meet students exactly where they are and bridge the gap between them and the SMSU staff so the union becomes a place that doesn't just serve students, but truly reflects them.

Beyond the board, I have consistently shown up for students in the ways they have expressed they need: through honest conversation without formality, through personal advocacy and being present when they are facing opposition, and by asking the hard questions during my time on the board.

Question 2: What do you hope to achieve as an SMSU Board of Director Student Representative?

[Our facilities:] As we expand the role of SMSU South, we have an opportunity to make basic needs a more visible and normalized part of student life. Right now, there's a stigma—students often see these resources as handouts rather than something meant for everyone. By creating a welcoming, multi-use space that includes things like lounge areas, lending services, and even thrift-style clothing closets, we can reduce that stigma and increase engagement. When more students participate, it not only creates a stronger sense of community—it also strengthens the case for continued funding and support. On a broader scale, I intend to position CSUSB as a sanctuary for basic needs; a campus where students stay because they feel supported, not just academically, but as whole people. By demonstrating how we uplift our community out of poverty, meet essential needs, and develop financially literate professionals, we can make a

compelling case to legislators that the work we do here is not only necessary but worth funding.

[How I intend to achieve this:] community events like night markets or vendor fairs draw in outside revenue but also increase food access and boost student presence on low-attendance days. By partnering with local marathons, car shows, or even hosting pool days, movie nights, and campus concerts with local bands, we can keep campus life alive and engaging while conserving SMSU reserves for the resources students truly matter to students.

[Lastly student communication:] If students are angry or frustrated, the first question we should ask is, "What don't they know, and how can we help them understand?" My leadership looks like turning emotion into action. When students speak up, even loudly, they're giving us honest feedback. Ignoring this isn't just a missed opportunity, it's a failure to serve. We have to lean into those tough conversations, because that's where the truth lives and that's how we grow with our students values.

I've contributed on a personal level by stepping in when I see our organization struggling to reach students by designing, printing, and hand-distributing flyers to increase visibility. My efforts extend beyond my title; I've shown up as a fellow student willing to do the hard, often unseen work like volunteering at local food banks (Sunrise PEACE Center) and community gardens (Rialto Community Garden), and organizing alongside grassroots coalitions dedicated to social change.

Through my major I am focusing on creating a connected community for San Bernardino that reflects the care we show for students in our organization through a non-profit event planning organization that allows other community partners to excel on limited funding. I am also working alongside my peer to create a company providing a suicide intervention tool for veterans and active military that struggle with symptoms of anxiety and high stress present in PTSD.

The skills I bring to the SMSU Board of Directors are my ability to lead, communicate, collaborate, support others, and take initiative. Whether I'm guiding students one-on-one, running a meeting, or organizing a workshop, I have learned how valuable it is to be prepared, ask questions, and step up. Taking initiative has played a major role in all of my leadership positions since starting college.

Starting my role as a Student Representative for the SMSU Board of Directors was a new and wonderful experience that introduced me to student leadership on a broader level. Transitioning into the Controller position was a major step forward, and with it came a whole new set of responsibilities I had never handled before. This role was unfamiliar territory budget discussions, policy revisions, and running meetings weren't things I had done in the past—but I was excited to take on this challenge and put my best foot forward. From the beginning, I took the initiative to meet with Executive Assistant to the Executive Director Elizabeth Junker and Budget Manager Maria Elena Najera-Nerito to better understand my responsibilities, prepare for meetings, and make sure I was fulfilling the role as effectively as possible. I've been incredibly grateful for the support I've received in navigating this position. Everyone has been open to answering questions, offering feedback, and helping me learn something I've truly appreciated as I've dedicated time and energy to learning and growing in this space. One major shift was going from sitting in meetings as a representative to running them as Chair of the Finance and Contracts Committee. This was a big challenge, but I knew I had to step up and prepare. I took time to study Robert's Rules of Order, since that's how our meetings are run, and reached out to others for guidance on how to lead effectively. The first time I ran a meeting, I was definitely nervous—but I pushed through, reflected afterward, and took note of how I could improve next time. I wanted to do better for my next meeting so I met with the Budget Manager and the Executive Assistant to go over how to run meetings better and I asked for clarification on any questions I had. I knew what I had to do to better prepare for the meetings. So, the second meeting I ran went so much better and I feel so much more confident now. That experience reminded me that growth takes practice, reflection, and a willingness to ask for help—all of which I've embraced fully in this role. Sitting on the Board of Directors since January, I've gained valuable, hands-on experience in administrative and financial management, working closely with others on the team and the Executive Director and CFO Vilayat Del Rossi. I've helped lead budget discussions, reviewed student fees, and participated in revising policies—all of which have helped me better understand how SMSU operates behind the scenes to support students. While the learning curve was steep, I'm proud of the way I've navigated this role—with initiative and commitment. I have grown more confident, more informed, and more excited to continue serving in this role. I would love to return to the Board of Directors and continue to grow in this role that has already taught me so

As I continue in this role, I have also stayed grounded in the roles that first brought me to student leadership. My time as a Resident Assistant has taught me how to build community, plan engaging events, and support students through meaningful connections. Events like Paint & Float, A Mocktail Mixer, and The Asada weren't just fun events I planned and worked with others to execute—they created safe spaces for students to connect, de-stress, and learn about campus resources. I also served as the Programming Chair for Coyote Village Dorm Council before this, where I collaborated with teams to organize inclusive events while managing

budgets and other logistics. In addition to this, my work with the Upward Bound Program based here at CSUSB has grown alongside me. I started as a volunteer with the College Corps Program, completing 450 hours of community service. From there, I was able to grow into a Student Assistant I position, and recently moved up to Student Assistant II. With this position, I am now a mentor for the students, where I support them through advising, tutoring, and leading workshops. These workshops involve coordination with other mentors—like setting up classrooms, managing outreach and RSVP forms, and assigning roles and tasks to the other staff before and on the day of the event. This job has taught me patience, strong communication, and collaboration with both students and staff. Supporting students and building trust with them has now become second nature to me, and I continue to strive to make them always feel seen and heard—skills I plan to bring with me to the Board of Directors to amplify student voices across CSUSB. All of these experiences reflect who I am: someone who is proactive and always committed to growing. I would be honored to continue serving on the SMSU Board of Directors and bringing my voice, my skills, and my continued growth back to the table.

I want to continue learning more about the committee itself—how we build, adjust, and manage budgets, how financial decisions are made in alignment with our mission, and how we can better communicate those decisions to the students we serve. The committee plays a key role in balancing the financial health of SMSU with the needs of students, and I want to become even more knowledgeable in this area by continuing to collaborate with staff and fellow board members. I also want to spend more time learning from everyone on the Board. Sitting alongside professionals has already taught me so much, and I want to continue building those relationships and asking questions so I can continue to represent the student body with confidence and knowledge.

My values from when I first joined the Board still stand—I care deeply about student engagement, inclusion, and creating community—but after stepping into this role, I now understand more of the real challenges we face: like how to pay for utilities, programming, and facilities while also creating meaningful experiences for students. I've seen firsthand how budget limitations impact what we can do, especially when it comes to boosting attendance and engagement at CSUSB. One thing that has stood out to me in our conversations on the board is the need to bring more students to CSUSB, but also to bring current students into the SMSU more often. This has made me brainstorm student outreach initiatives focused on getting students excited about engaging with the SMSU. Some of these could be hosting monthly center spotlights, where different departments in the SMSU could get a chance to showcase what they do through fun videos and giveaways. I would also love to see a "Union Link—Up" initiative where students are encouraged to visit the SMSU with friends and engage in activities with incentives like stickers and raffles. We can also bring more low-commitment workshops and mixers during high-traffic time during Coyote Hour and after peak classes. When I helped

table for the Board of Directors, I noticed how much foot traffic passes right by the SMSU during certain hours. Hosting things like scavenger hunts as we've done before, could really help bring students into the spaces and bring visibility to the SMSU. Of course, I still care about the goals I came in with—improving hours of operation, expanding the capacity of SMSU events, and especially supporting commuter students, who sometimes feel left out of programming. I've seen the power of collaboration, like when we opened The Asada to commuter students by working with the LatinX Center, and I want to continue those efforts—making sure all students feel seen and welcome. Ultimately, I hope to continue growing as a leader, learning more about finance and student engagement, and helping the SMSU remain a place that welcomes, supports, and energizes all students at CSUSB.




